Advocacy

The process of **urging** a person or entity that has the **power to make or influence** a decision to do so **the way you wish**..

A constant: 2 reasons pediatricians are not generally active in advocacy

3. Rancor



2. Beating back fake news






Elements & Order of a Compelling Advocacy Argument

- 1. Shared Problem: 2-3 data points
- 2. Make it personal Why do you care? Why do pediatricians care? Emotional example
- 3. Credible group that cares about this problem
- 4. Your solution



Conveying your message

- 1. In Person (policymaker/staff)
- 2. Personal communication to decision-maker (e.g., letter/email/phone call)
- 3. Traditional Media (e.g., letter to editor)
- 4. Social Media

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AAPCA Advocacy Priorities (2017)

Universal ACCESS to quality, comprehensive pediatric care in a medical home, including access to vaccines and behavioral and mental health treatment for every child in California, including vulnerable populations such as children with special health care needs, foster children, children of immigrant families, and LGBTQ youth. To make access a reality, ensure that state and commercial health care plan reimbursement fully supports quality primary and subspecialty pediatric care.



- Childhood poverty
- Childhood toxic stress and its causes, including violence, neglect and abuse, bullying, human trafficking, and discrimination
- Childhood obesity and food insecurity
- Youth marijuana use


